STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and as such, its governing documents are its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Ezra Umarpeh Limited was incorporated on 16 March 1999 in England under Company Registration number 03733589, and was registered with the Charity Commission on 19 June 2000, governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association, Charity Number 1081176.

In June 2012, a Branch Constitution pursuant to the Memorandum and Articles of Association was drawn up. This outlines the structure, governance and management of our two branches in Salford, Manchester and Barnet, North West London. Each branch is to set up its own management committee and elects one member to represent their branch on the Board of Trustees.

The power of appointing new Trustees or a new Trustee hereof shall be exercisable by the persons who are, for the time being, the Trustees hereof.

GRANT MAKING POLICY

All applications to the Charity for grants are considered carefully by the Trustees at regular meetings. On most occasions, if the Trustees feel that the application meets their approval in principle, they will meet applicants face to face and discuss with them details of the application. The Trustees usually then have a further meeting before making a decision as to whether assistance should be granted, and if so, to what level. All grants must be approved by the majority of the Trustees.

It is not however the policy of the charity to make grants except in exceptional circumstances.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees regularly undertake a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and systems designed to mitigate those risks are considered on an ongoing basis. This year, the trustees have placed particular attention to capacity building by reviewing and strengthening the governance and management of Ezra Umarpeh and ensuring its infrastructure can support the enormous growth of the organisation this year.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives of the Charity are

- (i) to relieve poverty, sickness and distress in particular;
- (ii) providing medical equipment;
- (iii) providing facilities in hospitals; and
- (iv) providing patient transport to and from hospitals.

The Charity is involved in the provision of benefit and assistance to the sick and infirm. The Charity also provides free use of medical equipment to those who qualify as Charitable Beneficiaries under English Law.

The Trustees have continued to comply with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit as published by the Charity Commission when exercising their powers or duties.

Ezra Umarpeh's mission is to provide patient support services for those challenged by illness and disability whether in hospital or at home, with a particular emphasis on easing and reducing the hospital experience. The charity provides culturally appropriate services aimed particularly at, but not exclusively to, members of the Jewish community.

Established in response to the voice of need from within the community, the charity delivers the following core services:

Free Loan of Medical Equipment

The free loan of a large and varied stock of medical equipment and mobility aids, which improves health and well being and promotes independence. This reduces the length of hospital stays and the risk of hospital bugs and enables patients to be cared for at home. Funding from the Six Point Foundation has made it possible for Ezra Umarpeh to offer equipment on long term loan to Holocaust survivors and refugees in necessitous circumstances.

Hospital Respite Rooms and Overnight Accommodation

10 hospital respite rooms are stocked with fresh kosher food and snacks, reading materials and Judaica, creating a haven for patients and allowing them to maintain religious or cultural practices whilst at the hospital.

Overnight Hospital Accommodation

Two flats right near the Royal Free Hospital are available to families when pre -booked. These are beautifully furnished and stocked with linens, towels, Kosher food, Shabbos urns and hotplates and Judaica. Providing comfortable sleeping accommodations so close to the Royal Free means carers can have respite whilst staying close to a loved one during critical times.

Accessible Transportation Services

Wheelchair accessible vehicles can be driven by our volunteers or a carer and provides comfortable travel service for people with illness or disability.

Our special arrangement with car services offers a practical solution for emergency Shabbos travel.

OUTPUTS AND OUTCOMES FOR 2013-14

2013-14 has witnessed tremendous growth in the demand for Ezra Umarpeh's core services, and the trustees are proud that these have been delivered with consistency and excellence.

90 trained volunteers were involved in running our services.

- 10 hospital respite rooms or mobile units were stocked and cleaned weekly, visited by over 10,000 people:
- 243 nights of accommodation provided near Royal Free and Central London Hospitals;
- 3164 medical or mobility items were loaned out to our service users;
- 1129 journeys were made with our accessible transportation vehicle;
- 1573 Shabbos Car Service journeys made on Ezra Umarpeh's account;
- 146 Carers benefitted from respite through our Sharing the Caring Service in Manchester.

VOLUNTEERING

Volunteering remains at the heart of Ezra Umarpeh's work, and the trustees would like to acknowledge the outstanding dedication of the volunteers who make the charity's activities possible.

The following was carried out by volunteers in 2013-14:

- Stocking of hospital respite rooms with fresh kosher food, non perishables, literature and Judaica;
- Maintenance and cleaning of hospital respite rooms and flats near Royal Free;
- Loaning medical equipment 'out of hours' to service users in urgent need;
- Delivering medical equipment to users who are homebound;
- Driving Ezra Umarpeh's accessible vehicle on behalf of service users;
- Sharing the Caring volunteers offering respite to carers at a patient's bedside

In total 90 volunteers delivered 9360 volunteering hours throughout the year. Based on the minimum wage, this provided a saving to the charity of £60,840.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN 2013-14

April 2013 - FUNDRAISING EVENT

Ezra Umarpeh held a fundraising event across three locations in North London, North West London and Manchester. Featuring cancer survivor Mrs Michal Trenk, the events drew large crowds from across their local Jewish communities in a strong show of support for the work of Ezra Umarpeh. Awards were presented to Chaplains from local hospitals in recognition of their dedicated efforts towards Ezra Umarpeh's hospital Shabbos Rooms. Following a moving video presentation, a grand raffle was drawn at each event, raising thousands of pounds for the charity.

June 2013 - WWW.EZRA-UMARPEH.COM

Our new website www.ezra-umarpeh.com was launched in June 2013. This has not only raised the profile of the charity's activities, but made them more accessible than ever. Visitors to the site are now able to find out where our respite rooms are, what items of medical equipment we currently stock including how to operate them and how to volunteer. They are able to make donations online and post reviews of our service - helping Ezra Umarpeh to stay in touch with its users and improve its performance. The website has already created awareness and generated nationwide requests for help

Aug 2013 - SHARING THE CARING SERVICE LAUNCHED IN MANCHESTER

A new Sharing the Caring Service has been launched in Manchester offering volunteer carers to sit at the bedside of a patient, during the day, overnight or on Shabbos and Yom Tov. Volunteers have received specialist training from local hospitals and have been registered with the hospital volunteer services to allow them access to the wards. This popular service has provided hours of respite to exhausted parents who need a break from being with a child in hospital or for those caring for an elderly parent. Sharing the Caring has been a pillar of support, allowing carers to juggle the needs of other members of their families and preventing carer breakdown.

Sep 2013 -TCES ACCREDITATION FROM HACKNEY

In September 2013, Ezra Umarpeh was awarded accreditation status to deliver a new equipment scheme in Hackney. Under TCES (Transforming Community Equipment Service) smaller medical and mobility equipment items will be available on prescription which users can present to Ezra Umarpeh who fulfil the prescription and offer advice on safe usage and maintenance, delivery and installation.

Nov 2013 - SECOND GALA DINNER (LONDON)

Our recent Gala Fundraising Dinner attended by over 350 guests on Tuesday 26th November at the Decorium, London N22. The event paid a special tribute to our dedicated volunteers who are at the forefront of our services. Highlights of the evening were the stunning cantorial renditions by world renowned cantor - Chazzan Yaakov Lemmer of New York who was accompanied by the famous Pianist Daniel Gildar from Philadelphia and a keynote address by Scotsman Radio show host Rabbi Y Y Rubinstein. A video presentation featuring Ezra Umarpeh's communal involvement and services allowed the guests to get a glimpse of what goes on within the organisation. The dinner was successful in raising awareness and funds to help us continue delivering excellent services.

Dec 2013 - NEW ACCOMMODATION NEAR ROYAL FREE HOSPITAL (LONDON)

In addition to the two flats run by Ezra Umarpeh of 86 Fleet Road NW3, The trustees of Ezra Umarpeh are delighted to announce the availability of a new flat at Constantine Road NW3, which is a two minute walk from the Royal Free Hospital. The flat is generously provided by a local donor and has been furnished to a high level of practicality and comfort with the sponsorships of local businesses. It is maintained and stocked by Ezra Umarpeh whose dedicated volunteers ensure linens are changed and food is replenished. There is a high demand for this service by families or carers of patients at the Royal Free who can now stay close to their loved ones in hospital, particularly over Shabbos.

March 2014 - NEW STUDIOS AVAILABLE NEAR UCLH AND CENTRAL LONDON HOSPITALS

In response to growing demand to offer accommodation to families of patients in Central London hospital, Ezra Umarpeh is pleased to offer a new service providing overnight accommodation at studio flats in the area. A short walk from the UCLH and GOSH hospitals, the flats are available over Shabbos and Yom Tov and are stocked with hotplates, kettle, flasks, Judaica and kosher snacks. Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and there has been a high uptake up of this service which has proven a a lifesaver to many of our grateful users.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

At the year end £48,407 was held as unrestricted funds and £199,318 was held as restricted funds.

The Charity's reserves comprise mainly Medical Equipment Loan Fund and also an Office Refurbishment Fund.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

New respite room in Great Ormond Street Hospital

After floor plans have been designed and finalized, building has been picking up speed in our new Hospital Respite Room at the Great Ormond Street Hospital. This scheme is part of a new build at the hospital. Ezra U'Marpeh looks forward to the opening of its doors. Our Respite Room is constantly in use at this Hospital and we hope the new room will enable us accommodate all the needs of our users to the best possible standard.

Hospital respite room at The Christie, Manchester

The Christie Hospital in Manchester is Europe's largest cancer centre, treating more than 40,000 patients a year. The community has welcomed the news that Ezra Umarpeh has now secured a room which will be opened within the next six months. The room will be open on Shabbos and during the week and will provide kosher food and drink, Judaica and Jewish literature. Joining the network of Ezra Umarpeh's Shabbos rooms, it will be a source of respite for the Jewish patients who frequent the hospital.

New loan scheme database

We are now at the final stages of designing our new medical equipment loan scheme database. In addition to our current databases' functions of managing loans, customer information, fully refundable deposits and equipment status, it will now boast new features that will increase our efficiency and give us more specific categorization for our data collection and improved customer service purposes. It will also link up our three branches and allow for improved distribution of our resources.

New accessible vehicle for Barnet branch

In response to the increasing number of requests for our wheelchair accessible vehicle coming from the North West London area, Ezra Umarpeh is in the process of purchasing a new vehicle for our Barnet Branch to provide local accessible transportation services for the disabled. Sponsored by the Adler family, the project is dedicated to the memory of the late Dr and Mrs Adler and will serve the North West London community to whom they were so devoted.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Voluntary income

Voluntary Income comprises donations and gifts in kind which are accounted for in the Statement of Financial Activities ("the SOFA") when the charity becomes entitled to the donation and any conditions for receipt are met.

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure.

Charitable activities

Charitable activities are only recognised in the accounts when paid.

Support costs

Support costs include costs relating to the administration and general management of the day-to-day affairs of the charity.

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and independent examination of financial statements, the costs of trustee meetings and cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds

General unrestricted funds comprise the accumulated surplus or deficit on income and expenditure account. They are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds

Restricted funds are funds subject to the restrictions imposed by the donor or funds raised for particular restricted purposes. The restrictions are binding upon the trustees of the charity.

Fixed Assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Medical Equipment - 25% (Reducing Balance)
Fixtures & Fittings - 10% (Reducing Balance)
Motor Vehicles - 25% (Reducing Balance)
Office Equipment - 25% (Reducing Balance)
Computer Equipment - 33% (Reducing Balance)
