Mr J Roitenberg was appointed as a trustee on 5 November 2012 and is representing the Manchester branch.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and as such, its governing documents are its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

It was incorporated on 16 March 1999 in England under company registration number 03733589 and was registered with the Charity Commission on 19th June 2000 under charity number 1081176.

The power of appointing new Trustees or a new Trustee hereof shall be exercisable by the persons who are, for the time being, the Trustees hereof.

GRANT MAKING POLICY

All applications to the Charity for grants are considered carefully by the Trustees at regular meetings. On most occasions, if the Trustees feel that the application meets their approval in principle, they will meet applicants face to face and discuss with them details of the application. The Trustees usually then have a further meeting before making a decision as to whether assistance should be granted, and if so, to what level. All grants must be approved by the majority of the Trustees.

It is not however the policy of the charity to make grants except in exceptional circumstances.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Trustees stand possessed of the Trust Fund upon trust to pay or apply the whole of the income and the capital of the Trust Fund (1) to relieve poverty, sickness and distress in particular; (2) providing medical equipment; (3) providing facilities in hospitals; and (4) providing patient transport to and from hospitals.

The Charity is involved in the provision of benefit and assistance to the sick and infirm. The Charity also provides free use of medical equipment to those who qualify as Charitable Beneficiaries under English Law.

Ezra Umarpeh's mission is to provide patient support services for those challenged by illness and disability whether in hospital or at home, with a particular emphasis on easing and reducing the hospital experience. The charity provides culturally appropriate services aimed particularly at, but not exclusively to, members of the Orthodox Jewish community.

Established in response to the voice of need from within the community, the charity delivers the following core services:

Free Loan of Medical Equipment

A large and varied stock of medical equipment and mobility aids, which improves health and well being and promotes independence. This reduces the length of hospital stays and the risk of hospital bugs and enables patients to be cared for at home.

Hospital Respite Rooms and Overnight Accommodation

10 hospital respite rooms are stocked with fresh kosher food and snacks, reading materials and Judaica, creating a haven for patients and allowing them to maintain religious or cultural practices whilst at the hospital.

Ezra Umarpeh manages respite rooms in the following hospitals:

Comfortable sleeping accommodations at the Royal Free hospital means carers can have respite whilst staying close to a loved one during critical times.

Accessible Transportation Services

Wheelchair accessible vehicles can be driven by our volunteers or a carer and provides comfortable travel service for people with illness or disability.

Our special arrangement with car services offers a practical solution for emergency Shabbos travel.

2012-13 has witnessed tremendous growth in the demand for Ezra Umarpeh's core services, and the trustees are proud that these have been delivered with consistency and excellence.

OUTPUTS AND OUTCOMES FOR EZRA UMARPEH HEAD OFFICE

Free Loan of Medical Equipment

- Currently stock over 2,200 items of medical and mobility equipment;
- 2,130 medical equipment and mobility items loaned out during 2012-13;
- 285 nursing pumps loaned last year to give mother and baby the best start in life;
- 18 hospital beds and 11 recliners on long term loan to older people.

Hospital Respite Rooms and Overnight Accommodation

- 10,120 people visited our hospital respite rooms last year;
- Overnight hospital accommodation allowed 228 relatives and carers to stay close by a loved one.

Accessible Transportation Services

- 175 ambulance journeys were driven by our volunteers in 2012-13;
- 836 Shabbos car journeys taken by service users during past year.

VOLUNTEERING

Volunteering remains at the heart of Ezra Umarpeh's work, and the trustees would like to acknowledge the outstanding dedication of the volunteers who make the charity's activities possible.

The following was carried out by volunteers in 2012-13:

- Stocking of hospital respite rooms with fresh kosher food, non perishables, literature and Judaica;
- Maintenance and cleaning of hospital respite rooms;
- Loaning medical equipment 'out of hours' to service users in urgent need;
- Delivering medical equipment when users to users who are homebound;
- Driving Ezra Umarpeh's accessible vehicle on behalf of service users;
- Mailing and distribution of fundraising activities.

In total 63 volunteers provided 4,160 of volunteering hours providing a saving to the charity of £46,135.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees regularly undertake a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and systems designed to mitigate those risks are considered on an ongoing basis. This year, the trustees have placed particular attention to capacity building by reviewing and strengthening the governance and management of Ezra Umarpeh and ensuring its infrastructure can support the enormous growth of the organisation this year.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN 2012-13

July 2012 - Volunteers' Event

Ezra Umarpeh held a Volunteers Event for its volunteers across 10 hospitals in England. Attended by over 25 volunteers from North London, Barnet and Manchester the buffet event was a source of recognition and inspiration to the dedicated team who maintain the hospital respite rooms each week. The programme included Rabbi Dovid Tugendhaft as a guest speaker, a video presentation and some training activities.

October 2012 - New Respite Room at Homerton Hospital

Following much collaborative effort with the hospital trust, a brand new respite room was opened to the public at the rear of the hospital. Furnished to a high specification, the two new rooms feature both milky and meaty kitchens, two toilets, a large dining area and a built in Succah. The facilities are accessible all week and offer respite to the Orthodox Jewish community who frequent the hospital by providing Kosher snacks and drinks, Judaica, reading materials and traditional hot Shabbos meals.

November 2012 - Refurbishment of Sleeping Accommodation near Royal Free Hospital

Renovations were completed at 86 Fleet Road which is a two minute walk from the Royal Free Hospital. The flat was split into two, each containing its own front entrance and modern kitchen and toilet facilities, allowing two families to make use of the facilities in privacy. The flat is maintained by dedicated volunteers who ensure linens are changed and food is stocked. There is a high uptake on this service, which is used almost weekly. Families or carers of patients at the Royal Free can now stay close to their loved ones who are in hospital, particularly over Shabbos.

December 2012 - New Equipment Loan Scheme for Holocaust Survivors and Refugees

Thanks to a grant from The Six Point Foundation, Ezra Umarpeh has started providing brand new medical and mobility equipment items on long term loan for holocaust survivors and refugees. The new scheme involves specialist training for our volunteers who provide home visits to service users, offering a more personalised approach. The equipment provided is often unavailable under the NHS and the long term nature of the loans provides peace of mind to the many elderly holocaust survivors and refugees who have benefitted from this improved service.

March 2013 - New Branch Opens in Barnet

Just before Pesach, Ezra Umarpeh opened the doors of its newly refurbished premises at Granville Road NW2, to serve the Barnet community. The new branch is a result of a merger with Family Steinberg's Gemach Ezer L'Chaim and offers a modern drop in centre for the free loan of hundreds of items of medical and mobility equipment. This new venture has already proven extremely successful with many wheelchairs being loaned out before Pesach. This has facilitated early hospital discharges and allowed the elderly and disabled to attend synagogue and spend the festival in the company of family and friends.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

At the year-end £20,253 was held as unrestricted funds and £196,576 was held as restricted funds.

The Charity's reserves comprise of the Medical Equipment Loan Fund and also an Office Refurbishment Fund.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Ezra Umarpeh as a National Organisation

With branches established at the heart of the three largest UK Jewish communities, Ezra Umarpeh must shift from being a local community service to a national organisation. To this end, the charity must invest in capacity building to ensure it has secure infrastructure in place to support the growing demand for its services. This will include recruiting and training more staff and volunteers, reviewing its financial procedures and expanding its fundraising operations. At governance level, each branch has established its own committee with one of its members to be elected to represent their branch on the Board of Trustees. It is hoped that this transition will help us ease the burdens of illness and disability for a greater number of people, whoever they are, wherever they are.

Alongside our two new branches, an important development will be the construction of our website. This will not only raise the profile of the charity's activities, but make them more accessible than ever. Designs are nearly complete to host a modern, user friendly site that will guide users and supporters through our range of services. Visitors to the site will be able to find out where our respite rooms are, what items of medical equipment we currently stock and how to volunteer. They will be able to make donations online and post reviews of our service - helping Ezra Umarpeh to stay in touch with its users and improve its performance.

ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE MANCHESTER BRANCH

In February 2012, Ezra Umarpeh opened a new branch on 60 Leicester Road, Salford, to serve the local Manchester community. A management committee was established to provide leadership and direction and to work closely with Head Office to deliver Ezra Umarpeh's services in the area.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Free Loan of Medical Equipment

With the assistance of grant awards from Awards for All (£10,000) Simply Health (£5,000) and six point (£6,295) the branch purchased medical and mobility equipment to the value of £24,000. This expanded the range given over to Ezra Umarpeh by Dr Lieberman, who ran a small loan service until his emigration to Israel in 2012. Refurbishments to the basement and the installation of racking and a hoist enables all equipment to be stored, maintained and cleaned at local premises in the heart of the Salford Jewish community. Over the year, over 650 medical equipment loans have been made, often preventing hospital admissions or facilitating a speedy discharge.

Hospital Respite Rooms

Ezra Umarpeh manages three hospital respite rooms in Manchester. In July 2012, a storage and distribution area was set up at the rear of 60 Leicester Road to bring its operations in-house under direct supervision from the Branch Manager. Thanks to a grant of £12,000 from ESF/WEA, 10 new volunteers were recruited and trained to run this service. Hot and cold food, reading materials and Judaica are packaged each week and delivered to the hospitals. The committee wishes to thank the volunteers for their dedication and expresses gratitude to the local shops who sponsor products on a weekly basis. The rooms were visited by over 2,000 people this year and were a source of nourishment and respite to patients and their loved ones.

Accessible Transportation Services

In December 2012, The Zichron Moshe Foundation donated a wheelchair accessible vehicle to Ezra Umarpeh who now provide local accessible transportation services for the disabled. This is a volunteer led service which has provided 670 journeys this year.

OUTPUTS AND OUTCOMES FOR EZRA UMARPEH MANCHESTER BRANCH

During its first year, the newly opened Manchester Branch delivered the following:

Free Loan of Medical Equipment

- Over 60 volunteers involved in running services in Manchester;
- Over 765 items of medical and mobility equipment currently in stock;
- 590 medical or mobility items loaned out.

Hospital Respite Rooms

• Over 2,000 people visited Ezra Umarpeh Manchester Hospital Respite Rooms.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Voluntary income

Voluntary Income comprises donations and gifts in kind which are accounted for in the Statement of Financial Activities ("the SOFA") when the charity becomes entitled to the donation and any conditions for receipt are met.

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure.

Charitable activities

Charitable activities are only recognised in the accounts when paid.

Support costs

Support costs include costs relating to the administration and general management of the day-to-day affairs of the charity.

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and independent examination of financial statements, the costs of trustee meetings and cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds

General unrestricted funds comprise the accumulated surplus or deficit on income and expenditure account. They are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds

Restricted funds are funds subject to the restrictions imposed by the donor or funds raised for particular restricted purposes. The restrictions are binding upon the trustees of the charity.

Fixed Assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:
